FOUR KEY ELEMENTS TO SUCCESS

1. involving a broad group of stakeholders
2. choosing proven practices & programs
3. collecting & analyzing data
4. using performance improvement processes to improve outcomes

SYSTEMIC APPROACH IS CRITICAL

criminal justice system must operate as a system
strong/broad collaboration/communication
data-driven processes to restructure local system
data-driven system “diagnosis” & decision-making

THE POWER OF DATA

PEW *Results First* Model:

cost benefit of various interventions

utilizing county data to measure investments

working with CSAC to identify counties

2 to 3 counties; committed to expand to others

WE'VE LEARNED THAT COUNTIES...

started with different capacities
have different problems, priorities, needs
are likely doing *something* really well

those who are champions of systemic change
are well ahead of others

the researcher/practitioner relationship

with the fewest dollars
focusing on short term gains in the context of
long term outcomes

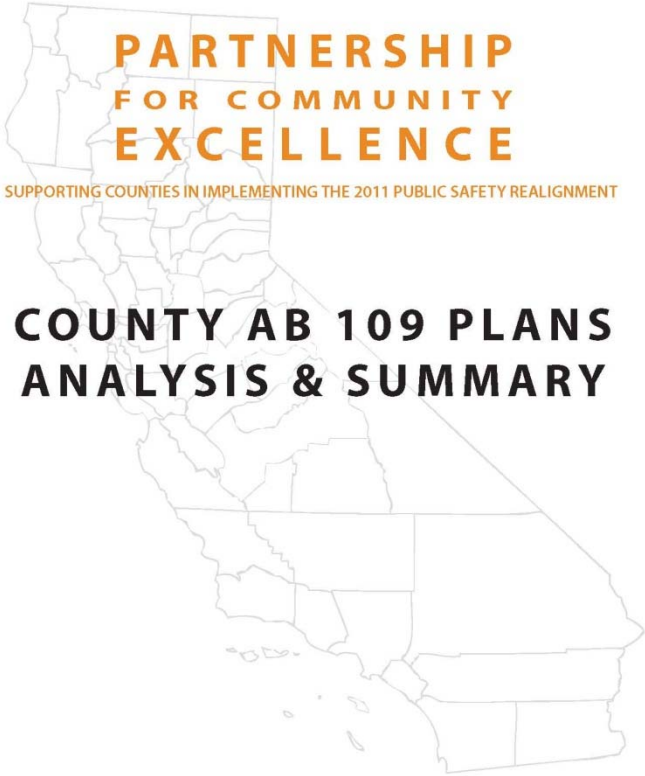

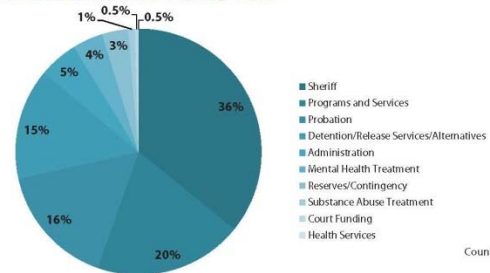

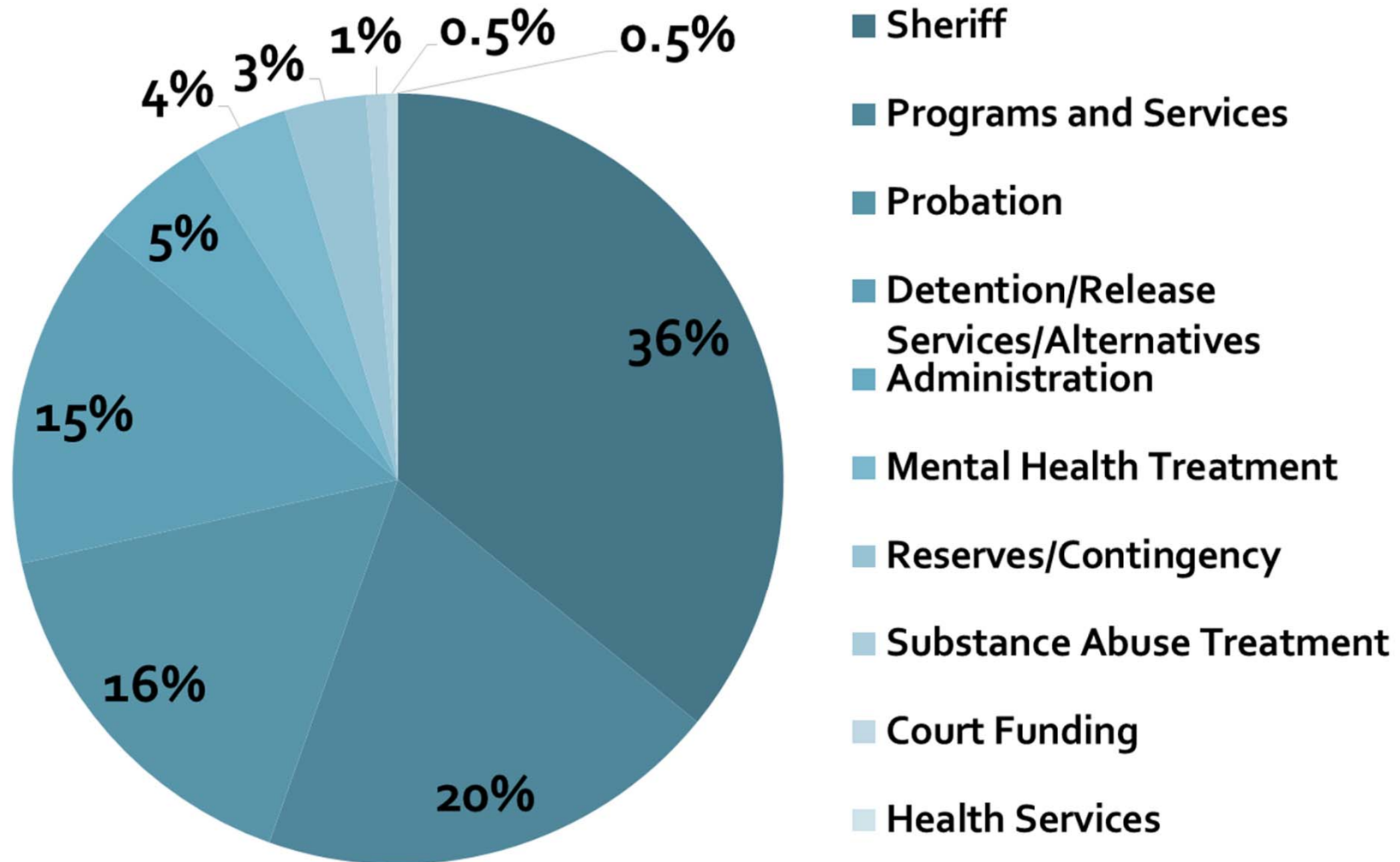
AB 109 PLAN EXPENDITURES: \$6,785,908.00
