Re: SB 1 Update: Project Lists Due Oct. 16, SCO Releases SB 1 FAQs, Polling Shows Support for SB 1, SB 1 Press Conferences, and More

We're writing to provide an update on the following SB 1 implementation activities:

- **Local Streets and Roads Project Lists Due October 16:** The CTC's template for local reports of planned RMRA-funded projects is [available on the CTC website](#) (visit www.catc.ca.gov and look for "Local Streets and Roads Proposed Project List Template" under "New - Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 - Senate Bill 1").

The form and a project list approved by the Board of Supervisors must be submitted to the CTC at LSR@dot.ca.gov by **Monday, October 16** in order for each county to receive its allocation of SB 1 local street and road funding beginning this winter. Please CC clee@counties.org and kvalentine@counties.org on your **submittal to the CTC.**

- **SB 1 FAQs:** The State Controller's Office developed a list of SB 1 Frequently Asked Questions, including questions and answers about Maintenance of Effort. You can view the FAQs here: http://www.sco.ca.gov/aud_road_maintenance_sb1.html.
 - **CSAC staff are interested in hearing from counties about how their MOE determination process is going generally. We are hopeful it will go smoothly for all but would appreciate knowing whether your county is going to request changes to your annually reported information, make a request to eliminate any one-time revenues from your calculation, etc..**
- **Poll Finds Majority Opposition to SB 1 Repeal:** As reported in an earlier email (see attached), there is an effort by a number of California Republicans in Congress to repeal SB 1 in order to draw turnout in the November 2018 general election. In a related development, polling on the title and summary of a similar repeal effort by Assembly Member Travis Allen revealed that a majority of Californians oppose repealing the new taxes and fees authorized under SB 1. While this is good news, we are still working hard to reach out to California's Republican Representatives to discuss with them the failings of an SB 1 repeal effort. - **SB 1 Implementation Press Conferences Planned Around the State:** In anticipation of the SB 1 revenue increases taking effect on November 1st, CSAC and the Fix Our Roads Coalition are planning six press conferences around the state to share with the public/media the benefits of the new funding to their region. The events will occur during the weeks of October 23 and October 30th. We do not have specific locations or dates yet, but please stay tuned for more information in the coming days. We will call upon public works directors and staff to assist Supervisors at these events and/or participate directly.
- **SB 1 Website is a One Stop Shop:** The California State Transportation Agency has developed the following website to promote the benefits of SB 1: <http://rebuildingca.ca.gov/resources.html>. In addition to an interactive map of SB 1 projects (which will include local projects lists submitted to the CTC by November 1st) there are fact sheets and other useful documents/tools for your information and use. I've also attached an SB 1 Fact Sheet created by Transportation California.
- **SB 1 Partnership Forums:** Caltrans District Offices are in the process of planning SB 1 Partnership Forums around the state. The forums are intended to provide a venue to discuss SB 1 implementation issues, specifically workforce, supplier and materials, utility coordination, etc. See attached flyer for the forum that already took place in San Diego to get an idea of the agenda/topics for future events. Below is the still be developing schedule for remaining Caltrans districts. We will share current information as it becomes available.
