Bill	Author	Topic	Potential Mandate Impact
AB 1299	Ridley-Thomas	Medi-Cal: specialty mental health services: foster children.	Increases the responsibilities of county probation agencies and child welfare services agencies with respect to determining whether presumptive transfers are appropriate.
AB 1661	McCarty	Local government: sexual harassment prevention training and education	Requires local agency officials to receive sexual harassment prevention training and education, and requires an entity to consult with the city attorney or county counsel when developing curricula in regards to the sufficiency and accuracy of proposed content.
AB 1669	Hernández, Roger	Displaced employees: service contracts: collection and transportation of solid waste.	Would require certain information be provided to bidders in writing at least 30 days before bids for the service contract are due, and provides bidding preference.
AB 1678	Santiago	Provision of incident reports to victims.	Requires local law enforcement agencies to provide a copy of certain reports to a victim of sexual assault, stalking, human trafficking, or abuse of an elder or a dependent adult.
AB 1797	Lackey	In-home supportive services: application.	Requires counties to provide applicants for in-home supportive services with a confirmation number.
AB 1829	Levine	Vessels: operation under the influence of alcohol or drugs: chemical testing.	Requires peace officers to advise arrested individuals that a criminal complaint may be filed against him or her for operating a vessel or water-related device while under the influence of an alcoholic beverage or any drug, or both; that he or she has a right to refuse chemical testing; and that the officer has the authority to seek a search warrant compelling him or her to submit a blood sample.
AB 1998	Campos	Juveniles: data collection. (pending)	Requires additional reporting and review on programs, strategies, and system enhancements.
AB 2027	Quirk	Victims of crime: nonimmigrant status	Requires additional forms related to witness cooperation, immigration status, and human trafficking.
AB 2028	Cooper	Public employees' retirement: involuntary termination: reinstatement.	Requires local government employers to provide certain notifications and information regarding reinstatement of employees.
AB 2057	Stone, Mark	CalFresh: victims of domestic violence.	Authorizes individuals who currently reside in, or are on a waiting list for, a shelter for battered women and children who are currently included in a certified household that also contains the abuser to apply for and if eligible receive expedited services of an additional allotment of CalFresh benefits as a separate household. Additionally requires county human services agencies to provide, upon request, a supply of CalFresh applications used to request such expedited services.
AB 2062	Lopez	CalWORKs: income or household composition reporting: benefit redetermination.	Increases the administrative oversight duties for counties. Prohibits the county from assessing an overpayment for the month following a change in income for a recipient of CalWORKs, or following a change in household composition for a CalWORKs assistance unit that does not include an eligible adult, if the recipient has reported the change and

			the county was unable to provide 10 days' notice of the termination or reduction in benefits.
AB 2252	Ting	Remote accessible vote by mail systems.	Establishes a framework for voters with disabilities to electronically receive and mark a vote by mail using a remote system.
AB 2269	Waldron	Animal shelters: research animals: prohibitions.	Creates new conditions for operations of local public animal service entities, including restrictions on when animals may be euthanized and limits on transferring living animals to a research facility, animal dealer, or other person for purposes of research, experimentation, or testing.
AB 2298	Weber	Criminal gangs	Requires notice to adults designated as a suspected gang member, associate, or affiliate. A person on the gang database would have the ability to contest the designation. Also requires certain privacy and accuracy standards and reporting.
AB 2307	Chau	Weights and measures: reporting fraud.	Adds additional duties to county sealers, including coordination with law enforcement authorities as needed in investigating and prosecuting fraudulent activity if the sealer receives information or evidence that a weighing or measuring device, parking meter, or other installment under his or her jurisdiction has been altered in such a way as to facilitate fraud.
AB 2311	Brown	Emergency services: access and functional needs in emergencies.	Requires counties to integrate access and functional needs into emergency plans.
AB 2466	Weber	Voting: felons	Clarifies that a person who is not imprisoned or on parole for the conviction of a felony is eligible to register to vote. This requires counties to change statements included in voter registration programs.
AB 2498	Bonta	Human trafficking.	Authorizes the withholding of the names and images of a victim of human trafficking and that victim's immediate family from disclosure until the investigation or any subsequent prosecution is complete, upon request of the victim. Requires law enforcement agencies to orally inform the person who alleges to be the victim of human trafficking of this right.
AB 2561	Irwin	Water supply planning: projects: photovoltaic or wind energy generation facility.	Exempts certain proposed photovoltaic or wind energy generation facilities from the definition of "project." The bill would thereby extend the duties on local agencies with respect to determining whether a project is subject to the water supply assessment requirements.
AB 2792	Bonta	Local law enforcement agencies: federal immigration policy enforcement: ICE access. (pending)	Requires a local law enforcement agency, prior to an interview between the United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) and an individual in custody regarding civil immigration violations, to provide the individual a written consent form, as specified, that would explain, among other things, the purpose of the interview, that it is voluntary, and that the individual may decline to be interviewed. The consent form would need to be available in certain languages. Additional documentation related to copies of information and notifications. The bill additionally requires the local governing body to hold at least one public community forum to provide information to the public about ICE's access to individuals and to receive

			and consider public comment.
AB 2801	Gallagher	Local government: fees and charges: written protest.	Requires local agencies to maintain a written protest for a proposed fee or assessment that the local agency receives for at least two years following the hearing date when the protests are considered.
AB 2877	Committee on Human Services	CalWORKs: rehabilitation services.	Requires counties to ask a CalWORKs recipient whether the recipient is eligible for and takes advantage of the state earned income tax credit that became available in 2015, to give the recipient the state earned income tax credit form, and to encourage and assist the recipient to take advantage of it.
SB 450	Allen	Elections: vote by mail voting and mail ballot elections.	Requires an elections official who receives a vote by mail ballot that he or she did not issue to forward that ballot to the elections official who issued the ballot no later than 8 days after receipt.
SB 823	Block	Criminal procedure: human trafficking.	Establishes a separate petition process for a person who has been arrested for, convicted of, or adjudicated a ward of the juvenile court for committing a nonviolent offense while a victim of human trafficking. Increases the number of records local agencies would be required to seal and destroy.
SB 1143	Leno	Juveniles: room confinement.	Requires the confinement of a minor or ward in room in accordance with specified guidelines.
SB 1200	Jackson	Animal cruelty: criminal statistics.	Requires local agencies to collect and report additional information to the Attorney General.
SB 1389	Glazer	Interrogation: electronic recordation.	Sets requirements for electronic recording applicable to the custodial interrogation of any person suspected of committing murder.
